
PERSONAL, SOCIAL, EMOTIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Maths

During our daily Maths sessions, we provide the

children with a broad range of skills needed to develop a mathematical understanding. 🥨 We also provide opportunities to develop skills using shape, measure and spatial thinking.

This half term we are learning the 4 basic shapes, square, circle, triangle, rectangle and concentrating on numbers 1-5.

The children will enjoy a range of activities to help them recognise, order and understand counting principles such as counting one by one.

Understanding The World

Within this area we investigate past and present, people, culture and communities and the natural world. This half term, as we are getting to know each other we will have discussions about ourselves and our families, we will also celebrate some of our birthdays. We will begin to explore our environment and look at changes as we move through the seasons. We will also learn about where we live and the name of our village and town.

We have lots of opportunities for the children to develop their fine and gross motor skills. In the nursery playground we have climbing equipment, bikes, digging, water play to name but a few...


We also practise our cutting skills and pencil control and take part in fine motor activities to help us perfect this skill. When we learn a new phonics sound we learn how to form


