

Online Safety	Behaviour and anti-bullying policy to include Online Safety and Prevent Duty. Online Safety policy to include Prevent Duty when review is due. The internet is filtered and monitored by software called SENSO, which is provided by L.E.A.D IT. This is a solution specifically designed for schools that detects if the user is a staff member or a student and gives the relevant level of filtering. If the user is unknown, then the student filter will apply. SENSO is fully PREVENT compliant and follows UKSICs guidelines around filtering and monitoring. 	SENSO's databases and lists are constantly updated as new threats and harmful content is identified, staff are able to log any concerns or issues to L.E.A.D IT support so that the filter can be updated to mitigate any issues.	Curriculum Lead
